Pilgrimage Walk to Holy Trinity Church Dorchester:

A group of pilgrims from Our Lady of Lourdes Blandford will be walking from Puddletown to the Holy Door at Dorchester and would be delighted if anyone from Holy Trinity would like to join the party.

The walk starts from Puddletown crossroads at 10.11 when the bus from Blandford arrives. There is a bus from Dorchester arriving in Puddletown at 9.45, otherwise parking may be found in the village. You would need to be reasonably fit for the six mile walk and have suitable clothing, footwear, water and a packed lunch. **Jubilee Year 2025 – Prisoners' Mass:** As part of the Jubilee Year 2025 celebrations, a special Jubilee Prisoners' Mass will be celebrated at **Holy Trinity Church on Sunday 19th October at 8:30 am.** The Liturgy will include special readings and prayers for prisoners, their families, and all who support them in pastoral care.

**Altar Servers and Youth Retreat – 13th December:** During this Jubilee Year, a Faith Renewal Retreat for all altar servers and youths will be held on **Saturday 13th December from 10:00 am–3:00 pm at Holy Trinity Parish Centre.** Fr. Jacek will be guiding the Retreat, which will include Talks, Confession and Holy Mass. Programme details to follow.

### PARISH UPDATES AND PROGRAMMES

**Prisoners' Sunday – 12<sup>th</sup> October:** Prisoners' Sunday is the National Day of Prayer and Action for prisoners and their dependents as marked by the Catholic Church and across the Christian denominations. Today we reflect on how we as individuals, as a Church, and as a community are serving those affected by imprisonment.

**Blessing of Graves:** During November, Fr. Babu will be visiting the various Cemeteries to bless the Graves. If you would like Fr. Babu to bless an individual grave, please could you be present to show him where it is located, otherwise he will give a general Blessing. Dates and times are as follows:

<u>2 November: 2.00 pm - Fordington,</u> meet in St George's Church Car Park; <u>9 November: 2.00 pm - Weymouth Avenue,</u> meet by the Chapel close to the Entrance; <u>16 November: 2.00 pm - Charminster,</u> meet at the Parish Church first followed by the Cemetery near the School; <u>30 November: 2.00 pm - Poundbury,</u> meet by the Entrance. Please note that the visit to <u>Hamdown Burial Ground Shillingstone</u> will take place on <u>Monday 17 November at 10.30 am</u> – please meet in the Car Park there. Please speak to Fr. Babu if you would like him to bless graves at other Churchyards.

**Church Roof:** As many of you know part of the Church roof has been leaking for many years. Helpful work has been done in the last two years, including clearing the drainpipes and fixing slates that have slipped. However, we have been advised that the flat gradient of the roof valley drainage is an underlying issue, and work will be starting soon to fix this. The valley gradient will be steepened, and the lead will be extended higher on either side, so that the rainwater should drain away better to the drainpipe. The work is expected to last 3 weeks and the Diocesan Property Team are providing professional support with the project's contractual arrangements. It is expected to cost about £30,000 and we have received a grant of £5,000 from the Dorset Historic Churches Trust. (Thank you to all who have taken part in Ride and Stride over the years: this fundraising provides funds for the Dorset Historic Churches Trust). The Balance of the Expenditure will be met from Parish Income. (Thank you to all who contribute regularly by Standing Order, Card Machine, Loose Plate, and Envelopes).

**Finances:** The Parish is grateful to all Parishioners who support the Parish financially. The Offertory collections for September were as follows: Standing Orders £5,036.00; Card machine £535.00; Envelopes £204; Loose plate £1,525.45; Total for September 2025 £7,300.45. Thank you to all Parishioners.

**The Card Machine** is available for your Offertory giving and you can Gift Aid Offertory donations. It is also available for purchases from the Repository.

**Hymn Books:** You will notice that we have new Hymn books this weekend. They are a gift from some Parishioners for which we thank them. If you would like to pay for something else that needs renewal or repair in the Church, please speak to Fr Babu.

**Presbytery Gardening:** We have quite a lot of gardening work to do around the Presbytery. We kindly ask those who are able to help to come along on **Saturday 1**st **November at 11:00 am**. Many hands make light work, and there is plenty to be done!

Anti-Slavery Week (13th–19th October): In this Jubilee Year of Renewal and Hope, we are called to "proclaim liberty throughout the land" (Lev. 25:10) by confronting the injustices of modern slavery. Observing this week is a way to live the Gospel call to love our neighbour and work for a world where all can live in dignity. **Stop Assisted Suicide** - further action needed! As the Assisted Suicide Bill progresses through the Lords, Peers have made it clear that receiving physical letters will have the most influence at this stage of the process. Right To Life UK has launched a new Easy Action tool that creates a personalised letter to be sent in the post to a Peer highlighting a key concern with the Bill, selects a Peer to receive it, and customises the letter so that it is addressed from you. ### Sunday Reflections: OT XXVIII [C] (Oct 12, 2025): II Kgs 5:14-17; II Tm 2:8-13; Lk 17:11-19

Introduction: Today's Readings focus on gratitude—how God desires us to recognize and give thanks for His blessings. The Gospel story of the "Forgetful Lepers" reminds us that God feels joy when we are thankful and sorrow when we are not.

- First Reading: Naaman, a Syrian military commander and non-Israelite, was healed of leprosy. His gratitude led him to acknowledge and serve the God of Israel.
- Second Reading: St. Paul encourages Timothy to remain grateful to God, even amid suffering and challenges, trusting in God's faithfulness.
- Gospel: Of ten lepers healed by Jesus, only a Samaritan returned to thank Him. This story shows that faith and gratitude go hand in hand, and God's love extends to all peoples, even those considered outsiders.
- 1. Practice gratitude daily: Thank God through prayer, family devotion, and acts of forgiveness. Show gratitude to others by loving and caring for them, including our parents. Cultivating an "attitude of gratitude" brings God's love, mercy, and compassion into our lives.
- 2. Celebrate the Eucharist: The Mass is the supreme act of thanksgiving ("Eucharist" means thanksgiving). By participating in the Holy Eucharist, we thank God for Jesus, the guidance of the Holy Spirit, and the blessings of the Church. We also express gratitude through sharing our time, talents, and resources in Parish life and community service.
