Sunday Reflections: OT 33 [C] (Nov 16, 2025) Mal 3:19-20a; II Thes 3:7-12; Lk 21:5-19

Introduction: Today's Readings focus on the "Day of the Lord" — Jesus' Second Coming. They remind us that the end of our lives and the final judgment will come, so we should stay ready.

Summary of the Readings: Malachi warns that the Lord's Day will bring reward for the faithful and judgment for evildoers. Paul tells the Thessalonians not to sit idle while waiting for Jesus, but to keep working and living responsibly. Today's Gospel passage underlines the truth that the date of the end of the world is uncertain. Jesus' promise of the protective power of a providing God was meant to encourage His disciples to persevere in their Faith and its practice. Jesus later adds the signs of the destruction of Jerusalem and the end of the world to prepare His disciples and to remind them to rely upon him, not their own power, for Salvation.

Messages:

- 1. Be ready each day by doing God's will through prayer, loving service, mercy, forgiveness, and examining our conscience.
- 2. Remember this world is temporary. What matters is being faithful to God and living that faith daily, even when it is difficult. Pray for the strength to persevere.

Funny/Happy/Inspirational Stories: He inspired many young people who went on to have wonderful careers in television, leaving a lasting impact on those who worked with him. His guidance, encouragement, and gentle humour were a source of motivation for all.

Service at Holy Trinity Parish: Joe was deeply committed to his faith and to the church, which played a central role in his life. He was a regular at Holy Trinity Parish and sang joyfully in the choir. His devotion and presence enriched the parish community, and he lived and died in faith. (Josie)

Joe's funeral service will be held at Edington Abbey, Birmingham, on Tuesday, 18th November 2025, at 11:30 am, followed by a Committal Service at the Crematorium at 1:00 pm.
